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# Introducing Tbilisi

Tbilisi has 1.3 Million residents and is the most important city and the political and economic centre of Georgia. It lies on the fringe of the Trialeti Mountain Range, the river Mtkvari flows through the city. Sovereign Vakhtang Gorgasali founded the city about 16 centuries in the past. The hot springs gave the city its name, "tbili" meaning "warm" in Georgian.

Situated on a meeting point between Europe, Asia and the Middle East, the extended history and the unique setting shaped the look of the city. The visitor's journey becomes excellent by the widespread welcoming of the native inhabitants. The simple presence of a foreign traveler can start a spontaneous party, a "supra" as Georgian people refer to it, to express respect the guest.

Tbilisi's historic centre, with stone paved back alleys and picturesque classic houses, is among the main tourist attractions. Around the continually renewed area around Meydan, Freedom Square and Baratashvili Bridge several of the ancient attractions can be found. You will find the Sioni Church, the old Synagogue and the dynamic Chardeni Area with eating places and bars.

South of the Meydan stands the famous Abanotubani. The sulphur springs, that gave the name to Tbilisi, are still used today. You can bathe in sulphur water and get scrubbed, just like the old days. Access to the botanical gardens and the Narikala Fortress is right behind the grand Mosque, which is placed next to the bath houses. From this position, one can get a view on the opposite bank of the river and Metekhi Church on the top of the rocks.

The cultural value of the capital can also be noticed by its several of museums and galleries. Dozens of classic buildings from numerous time periods and the country's provinces can be discovered in the Ethnographic Outdoor Museum in Vake, including even a Svanetian tower. From that position, it is also simple to access Turtle Lake and experience the look at the city.

Large amounts of retailers are found on the city's main shopping areas, Rustaveli Avenue as well as the newly renewed Aghmashenebeli Avenue in the picturesque Marjanishvili area. Throughout Old Town, souvenir searcher will get a large choice of Georgian fine art and craft. The flea market on the Dry Bridge features anything from cherished collectibles via crazy soviet memorabilia to old books.
